Networking dinner: Café Louvre, Národní 22, Prague 1 (metro B and tram stop Národní třída, trams No. 1, 2, 5, 9, 12, 14, 18, 22, 23 & 1 min walk)

TRANSPORT FROM / TO THE AIRPORT

Uber, Bolt to order and taxi available at the airport (taxi around CZK 650, other means of transport may be cheaper depending on the traffic)

Public transport:

- You can download the [Lítačka app](#), also available in English. Through the app, you can buy tickets, check timetables, maps and all the necessary information about public transport in Prague.
- Take **BUS 119** from the Vaclav Havel Airport. The bus stops are located in front of Terminal 1 (non-Schengen countries) and 2 (Schengen countries). There is a vending machine to buy tickets (buy a one-way ticket for 40 CZK, valid for the next



90 minutes. Tickets must be validated the first time you enter a public transport vehicle. Get off at the end stop, **Nádraží Veleslavín**, and change to **Metro line A** (green line) to go to the centre. The entire journey takes approx. 45 min. altogether. Before midnight the buses and metro run approx. every 10 minutes.

- Night public transport (running after midnight):
 - Take **BUS 910** (stops at the airport at the same bus stop as BUS 119), get off at **Karlovo náměstí** to get to the city centre.
 - Or, take **BUS 907**, get off at **Hradčanská** and change to tram 97 to the city centre.

RECOMMENDED ACCOMMODATION

5* Eurostar Thalia

Národní 13, Prague 1

Located just next to the tram station Národní divadlo (National Theatre) and 14 minutes on foot from the venue, or 2 tram stops away (no. 22 to tram stop Hellichova).

4* Hotel CUBE

Křemencova 164/18, Prague 1

Located approx. 2 minutes from the tram station Národní divadlo and 16 minutes on foot from the venue, or 2 tram stops (see above).

4* Hotel U Jezulátka

Na Kampě 10, Prague 1

Located approx. 2 minutes on foot from the venue and 6 minutes from the tram station Hellichova.

4* Malostranská Residence

Malostranské náměstí 24, Prague 1

Located approx. 7 minutes on foot from the venue and directly at the tram station Malostranské náměstí.

4* Hotel At the Golden Scissors

Na Kampě 6/494, Prague 1

Located approx. 2 minutes on foot from the venue and 6 minutes from the tram station Hellichova.

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3* Hotel Ikona

Míšeňská 8, Prague 1

Located approx. 4 minutes on foot from the venue and 4 minutes from the tram station Malostranské náměstí.

3* Hotel William

Hellichova 5, Prague 1

Located approx. 4 minutes on foot from the venue and 4 minutes from the tram station Malostranské náměstí.

3* Hotel U Kříže

Újezd 20, Prague 1

Located approx. minutes on foot from the venue and directly at the tram station Újezd.

Old Royal Post Hotel

Maltézské Náměstí 8, Prague 1

Located approx. 4 minutes on foot from the venue and 3 minutes from the tram station Hellichova.

3* Hotel Páv

Křemencova 13, Prague 1

Located approx. 4 minutes on foot from the tram station Národní divadlo (see above) or approx. 25 minutes on foot from the venue.

3* Residence Corto Old Town

Havelská 15, Prague 1

Located approx. 5 minutes on foot from the tram station Národní třída, then 3 tram stops to the venue (No. 22 to tram stop Hellichova).

3* Red Chair Hotel

Liliová 4, Prague 1

Located approx. 10 minutes on foot from the tram station Národní divadlo (see above).



TRANSPORT AROUND PRAGUE

There is an extensive network of 3 metro lines A (green), B (yellow), C (red), trams and buses which run on schedule. Metro runs from 5 AM until 12 PM. There is regular night transport. See [DPP website](#).

Don't forget to buy and validate the tickets when entering the vehicle/metro. There are controller patrols that impose fines to stowaways.

- In trams, payment by contactless card is available (the machine for electronic payment is located near the middle entrance door).
- Tickets can be bought in all metro stations, at the bus stop at Václav Havel Airport, and at most newspaper stands.
- Tickets can be bought also through the PID Lítačka app (Android and Apple store)

You can buy a ticket from 30 min to 3 days ([fare pricelist](#)), however most of the city is easily accessible on foot. It is cheap and the best way to get to know the city. To go to the Prague Castle without walking up the hill, take tram no. 22 from Hellichova to Pražský hrad.

RESTAURANTS

There is a duty to inform customers about allergens in food, however, some restaurants use only the numbers (1-14) next to the menu item. Do not hesitate to ask the service about the content if the information is missing or you are not sure.

- **Restaurants around Národní třída**
 - [Café Louvre](#) – traditional café with a variety of food from vegetarian to Czech classics
 - [Estrella](#) – vegetarian restaurant – reservation needed
 - [Lokál](#) – traditional Czech food (meat, dairy, eggs & gluten) of good quality and Czech Pilsner beer – best in Prague (10 min from Old Town Square) – reservation might be a good idea esp. for evening visits
 - [Lokál u Jiráta](#) – same chain, but smaller and 5 minutes from Wenceslas Square
 - [Kantýna](#) – good quality dinner for meat lovers (5 min from Wenceslas Square)
 - [Lemon leaf](#) – Thai food



- [Pastva](#) – Czech vegan restaurant (10 min with the TRAM 9 from Národní divadlo to Anděl or with metro B from Národní třída to Anděl) – reservation needed, website is available in Czech only, but the restaurant itself is very good and with English speaking service and menu
- [Palo Verde Bistro](#) – vegan restaurant with homemade pasta and international vegan cuisine.
- [The Nest](#) – Asian modern cuisine, vegan, vegetarian friendly
- [Pivovarská restaurace Sladovna](#) – Cvikov brewery – good beer with several variations including special beers. Czech classic cuisine with vegetarian options. Location [here](#).

Traditional Czech food (meat, dairy, eggs & gluten) of good quality and best Czech Pilsner beer in Prague – reservation needed esp. for evening visits. Do not accept places in the cellar, insist on being seated on the ground floor (the taproom is the best).
- [Vegan's Prague](#) – vegan restaurant with stunning views on the castle situated in a very old house. You have to climb under the roof, definitely not for persons with reduced mobility. Located under Prague castle in Nerudova street.

CURRENCY

The Czech crown is the currency used in the Czech Republic. The exchange rate is approximately 1 EUR to 24.5 CZK. Please beware some of the currency exchange places and double check the rate you are getting. For up-to-date exchange rates see [the European Central Bank](#).

GMT/UTC +1 hour

WEATHER

Temperatures range from 0°C to 13°C throughout November and towards the end of the month tend to be on the cooler side. Usually it rains quite a bit and humidity is high. You'll have an average of 9 hours of daylight, but only about 2 hours of sunlight.

HEALTH CARE

No vaccination is required to enter the Czech Republic. During a visit to the Czech Republic, the European Health Insurance Card (EHIC) enables access to necessary state-provided healthcare on the same basis as for Czech residents.

DIAL CODE

The international dialling code for the Czech Republic is +420 (00420)

WIFI

Wifi is available in many restaurants, cafes, hotels and many other locations (e.g. at/in aboveground public transport vehicles and stops), European data available.

ELECTRICITY

In the Czech Republic the power plugs and sockets are of type E. The standard voltage is 230 V and the standard frequency is 50 Hz.



OPENING HOURS

- The usual opening hours are Monday to Friday from 8 or 9 am to 6 pm. **Supermarkets and shopping centres** are usually open 7 days a week until 9 pm, often even on public holidays. Some shops and petrol stations operate almost nonstop.
- **Banks** are open on weekdays during working hours. Busy branches in city centres are usually open later, until 8 pm. Access to cash machines is ensured 24 hours a day.
- **Authorities:** Monday and Wednesday are the standard office days for authorities, from 9 am to 5 pm. Some authorities provide services for the public on other days too, though offices are usually closed over lunch (usually from 12 noon to 1 pm).
- **Post Offices:** are open from 8 am to 7 pm and in large cities you will find branches which are open almost nonstop.

WARNINGS

Prague is one of the safest cities in the world, however, it is recommended to be aware about local tourist traps:

- **fraudulent currency exchange offices** (always check the amount of money, **never** change money in the street and be aware that a location in the centre doesn't guarantee it's safe)
- **overpriced taxi services** (if possible do not use the taxis on the street, it is better to call a dispatch. Ask for the price before you get on). These taxis are recommended:

- there are **pickpockets** in the centre, watch your belongings, please
- when walking around Prague, please notice that **trams always have priority over pedestrians, even on the pedestrian crossings**, some of them (for example the one at Národní třída) are quite dangerous

- If you are looking for green parks, the islands [Střelecký ostrov](#) (accessible from the Legion Bridge next to the National Theatre) or [Slovanský ostrov](#) are closer and will be awesome too. There is also the [Kampa park](#) where the conference venue is located. If you need more space, [Kinský garden](#) will be perfect.
